# Constitutional amendments

## H.B. 420, H.D. 1 Relating to Disclosure of Judicial Nominees

"Shall the judicial selection commission, when presenting a list of nominees to the governor or the chief justice to fill a vacancy in the office of the chief justice, supreme court, intermediate appellate court, circuit courts or district courts, be required, at the same time, to disclose that list to the public?"

H.B. 748, H.D. 2, S.D. 1, C.D. 1 Relating to Agricultural Enterprises "Shall the State be authorized to issue special purpose revenue bonds and use the proceeds from the bonds to assist agricultural enterprises on any type of land, rather than only important agricultural lands?"

## S.B. 886 Relating to State Justices and Judges

"Shall the mandatory retirement age for all state court justices and judges be increased from seventy to eighty years of age?"

S.B. 1084, S.D. 1, H.D. 1, C.D. 1 Relating to Early Childhood Education "Shall the appropriation of public funds be permitted for the support or benefit of private early childhood education programs that shall not discriminate on the basis of race, religion, sex or ancestry, as provided by law?"

### S.B 2876, S.D. 2, H.D. 2 Relating to Dams and Reservoirs

"Shall the State be authorized to issue special purpose revenue bonds and use the proceeds from the bonds to offer loans to qualifying dam and reservoir owners to improve their facilities to protect public safety and provide significant benefits to the general public as important water sources?"

### Voting on constitutional amendments:

Ballots containing "blank or "over" votes on the proposed constitutional amendments act as "no" votes in the total number of ballots cast. Hawaii law states that a constitutional amendment will pass ONLY if at least 50% of the total ballots cast vote "yes." This means that to ratify a proposed constitutional amendment, the percentage of "yes" votes must be a majority of the total ballot cast.
