- Bishop Silva announces that Marc Alexander, formerly a priest of the Diocese of Honolulu, petitioned to be returned to the lay state. Subsequently, he has lost the clerical state and has been dispensed from the obligation of celibacy by rescript of Pope Francis issued through the Congregation for Clergy. He is still a member in good standing of the Catholic Church, but may not exercise any priestly ministry.
- Bishop Silva has appointed Reverend Noé Acosta Perez as Chaplain for the Maui Hispanic Community, effective February 1, 2017.
