Insurance: Helpful Hints

- Do not lapse in payment for both home insurance and mortgage even if you have been required to evacuate.
- Ask your insurance company if they offer coverage for <u>additional living expenses</u> due to mandatory evacuation. Be sure to keep receipts for any living expense you have incurred. Examples include:
 - o Food
 - o Toiletries
 - o Clothing
 - o Rent/Hotel
- In addition to fire coverage, other types of damage that may be covered under your existing policy includes:
 - o Smoke
 - o Ash
 - o Theft
 - o Vandalism
- For most policies earthquake damage is excluded, however, you should check with your insurance agent.
- If you have a policy that covers "Other Structures" this is where your water catchment tank would be covered. Damages due to ash, etc, would be reported under this category.
