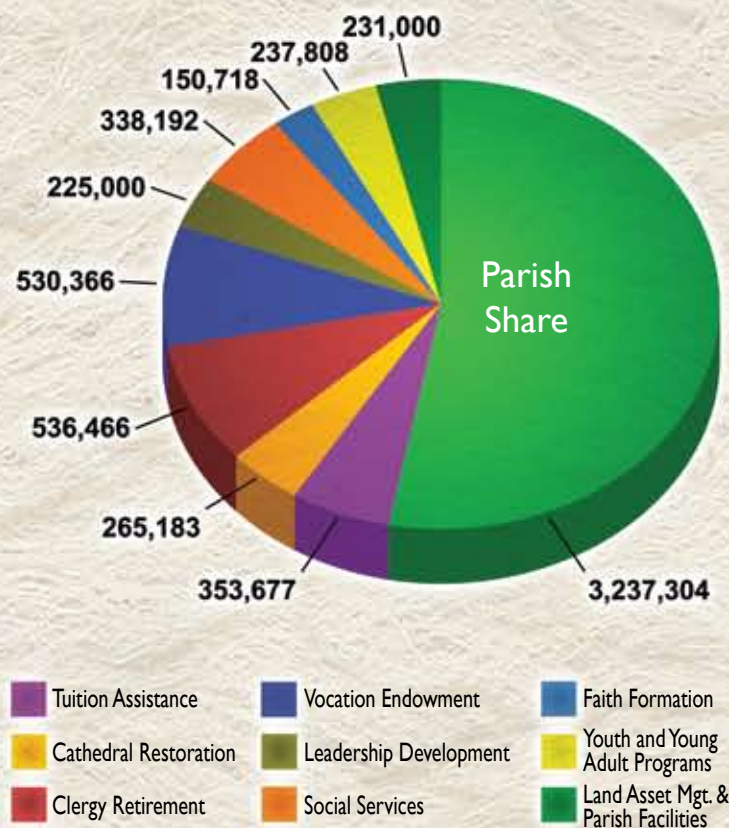

Celebrates the Disbursement  
of over \$6.1 million to date!**

July 30, 2010 marked the first ever diocesan wide disbursement for the Hawaii Catholic Community Foundation and the *With Grateful Hearts* Capital Campaign. All 66 parishes and two communities received their regularly scheduled parish share disbursements. In addition, all campaign intentions were eligible to receive a percentage of their total projected allocations .

The original goal of this capital campaign was set at \$30 million. The overwhelming response from donors throughout the islands enabled the *With Grateful Hearts* Capital Campaign to close out the active solicitation phase in January 2010 with gifts and pledges totaling over \$57 million!

In July 2010 the Hawaii Catholic Community Foundation (HCCF) had the first "full scale" disbursement. Disbursements went out to all 66 parishes, 2 communities and to all campaign intentions and approved proposals.

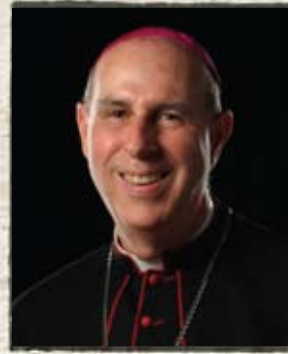

## Parish Redemption- 5 Parishes Exceed Goal!

*With Grateful Hearts* Capital Campaign donors have been faithfully making their campaign payments since the summer of 2008. As the Hawaii Catholic Community Foundation prepared for the very first Diocesan wide disbursement, the Office of Development is pleased to announce that Blessed Sacrament, St. Stephen, St. Michael Kailua-Kona, the Vietnamese Catholic Community and St. Anthony of Padua Kailua have all exceeded their original campaign goal in actual cash collected!

These parishes that are over goal in actual cash collected are moving from the 25% parish share category to the 50% parish share category. All 66 parishes and 2 communities are receiving campaign funds for the quarter 2, 2010 parish share disbursement. A big congratulations to all of these parishes!

## Social Services:

**Total Allocated as of June 30, 2010: \$338,192**

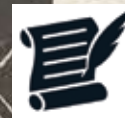
The allocations of campaign dollars will provide new funding for the better coordination of the Office for Social Ministry and the Office of Affordable Housing with community and government resources to increase the supply of affordable housing.



## Clergy Retirement:

**Total Allocated as of June 30, 2010: \$536,466**

A growing number of priests in the Diocese of Honolulu are beginning to reach retirement age. After a lifetime of devotion and service, we must ensure that they are taken care of in their retirement years. Monies allocated are directed to the funding of the retirement plan for diocesan priests.



## New Parishes & Facilities; Management of Land Assets:

**Total Allocated as of June 30, 2010: \$231,000**

Growth in Hawaii is creating a critical need for new or reorganized parishes, facilities and schools. Allocated dollars will ensure proper management and use of the land and properties of the diocese.



## Cathedral of Our Lady of Peace:

**Total Allocated as of June 30, 2010: \$265,183**

On August 16, 2008, our Cathedral became 165 years old. It was in this historic Cathedral that Father Damien was ordained a priest and Mother Marianne and her companions were first welcomed to Hawaii. The care and maintenance of this church is a sacred responsibility shared by all.



## Parish Share Fund:

**Total Allocated as of June 30, 2010: \$3,237,304**

The parish is the center of Catholic life. It is where we worship, baptize our children and see them grow closer to God through the sacraments.

Parish share disbursements occur on a quarterly basis. Disbursements for parishes were paid out at the end of July 2010. Last quarter, HCCF disbursed over \$2,038,065, bringing the overall total to \$3,237,304, for the parish share disbursements. Each parish has allocated their share towards various projects which they have prioritized: building and renovation, youth ministry, parish schools and debt reduction are just some of the projects that were listed.

The Hawaii Catholic Community Foundation (HCCF) reviews all applications and disburses monies that have been collected during the *With Grateful Hearts* Capital Campaign. Eighteen applications, totaling \$1,807,901, were submitted to the HCCF Board for review. Sixteen of the proposals met the specific intention criteria and were approved for funding for the 2010-2011 fiscal year. In addition to the case elements, HCCF distributes parish share disbursements on a quarterly schedule.

**Campaign Case Elements**



**Leadership Development:**

**Total Allocated as of June 30, 2010: \$225,000**

Continuing spiritual formation, education and training of clergy and lay leaders is central to the mission of the Church. Priests must be wise in management and have the skills needed to identify, oversee, and delegate to competent lay leaders.



**Faith Formation:**

**Total Allocated as of June 30, 2010: \$150,718**

Parishes and schools are blessed with the gifts and talents of deacons, clergy and laity whose generosity and devotion make possible the mission of Christ in the diocese. The allocation of campaign funds will allow programs for lay staff and volunteers to be strengthened and new programs established and implemented.



**Vocation Endowment:**

**Total Allocated as of June 30, 2010: \$530,366**

Currently the parishes of the diocese are served by 90 priests-each priest serves a community of approximately 13,600 people. The diocese must provide for the education and training of seminarians to ensure our parishes will have leadership needed in the coming years. This endowment will assist with the costs associated with the seminarian education.



**Youth & Young Adult Ministry:**

**Total Allocated as of June 30, 2010: \$237,808**

The diocese strives to ensure that parishes are inviting places, engaging the hearts and minds of our young people and creating generationally relevant programming. The allocation of campaign dollars will provide funding for the formation of leaders, programs, materials, and activities that empower youth and young adults to live as disciples of Christ, thus becoming active, participating members in the life, mission, and work of the Church.



**Tuition Assistance:**

**Total Allocated as of June 30, 2010: \$353,677**

The Augustine Educational Foundation provides tuition assistance for qualifying students attending Catholic schools throughout the diocese. Increasing the scholarship endowment will allow the foundation to increase grant levels as well as assist approximately 20 percent more families currently seeking aid.
